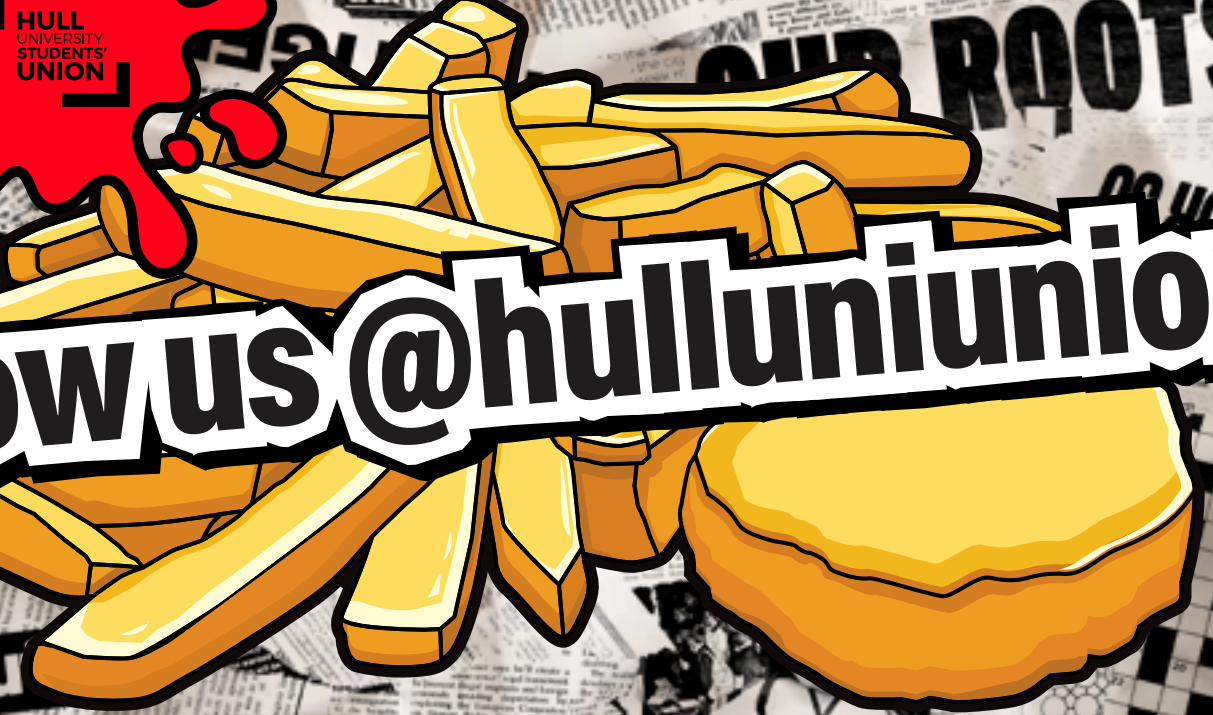
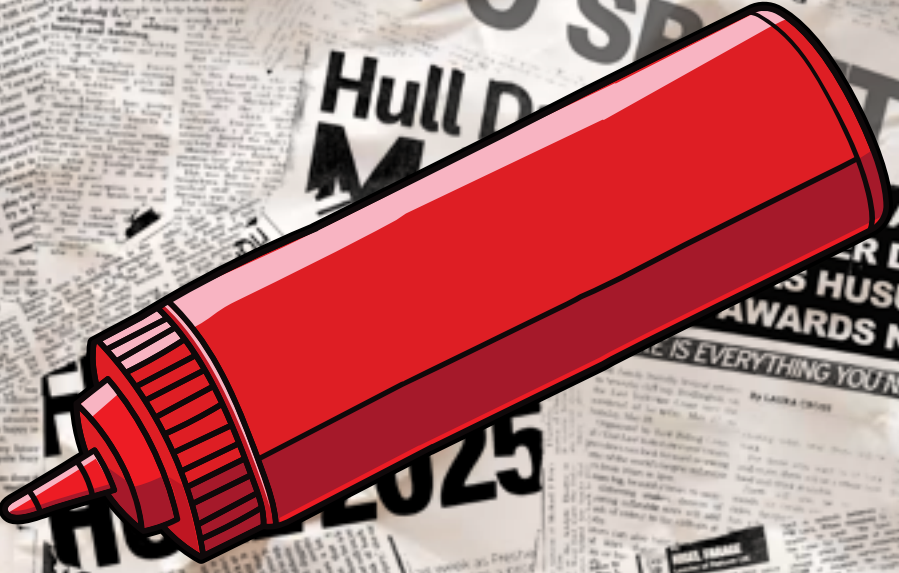

Hull City Centre is the historic and commercial heart of Kingston upon Hull, a port city in East Yorkshire. In the 13th Century, Edward I granted it the name "King's Town upon Hull," cementing its role as a trading hub. The Old Town, with its cobbled streets and medieval layout, still reflects this heritage. The area's iconic Humber Bridge, opened in 1981, was the longest single-span suspension bridge in the world when completed.

The centre has long been shaped by maritime trade, with Hull's docks once central to the city's prosperity. Today, landmarks such as Hull Marina, Princes Quay, and the Hepworth Arcade blend historic charm with a rich culture, a fun and vibrant social scene and modern shopping and leisure. Queen Victoria Square, home to the City Hall, Maritime Museum and Ferens Art Gallery, forms a cultural focal point.

Following major regeneration and investment after being named UK City of Culture in 2017, Hull City Centre continues to thrive as a destination for history, retail, entertainment, and the arts.



Old Town

Hull Old Town is the historic heart of the city, characterised by cobbled streets, medieval alleyways, the Fish Trail, and historical architecture. It's the place to head for museums, traditional pubs, and charming shops. Many may recognise Old Town from TV and film, including Victoria, Enola Holmes 2 and Bodies.

Maritime History

Hull's maritime history is a big part of what makes the city unique. From whaling ships to fishing fleets, the docks once powered Hull's growth. Today, you can explore this rich heritage through museums, historic landmarks, and the Marina, where old traditions meet a lively social and cultural scene.

1. Museum Quarter

The Museums Quarter is home to three fantastic, free museums. Visit Wilberforce House Museum the birthplace of William Wilberforce, Hull's famous anti-slavery campaigner. Dig into 235 million years of history at the Museum of Archaeology and take a trip through 200 years of transport history at the Streetlife Museum. **Plan your visit at HullMuseums.co.uk**

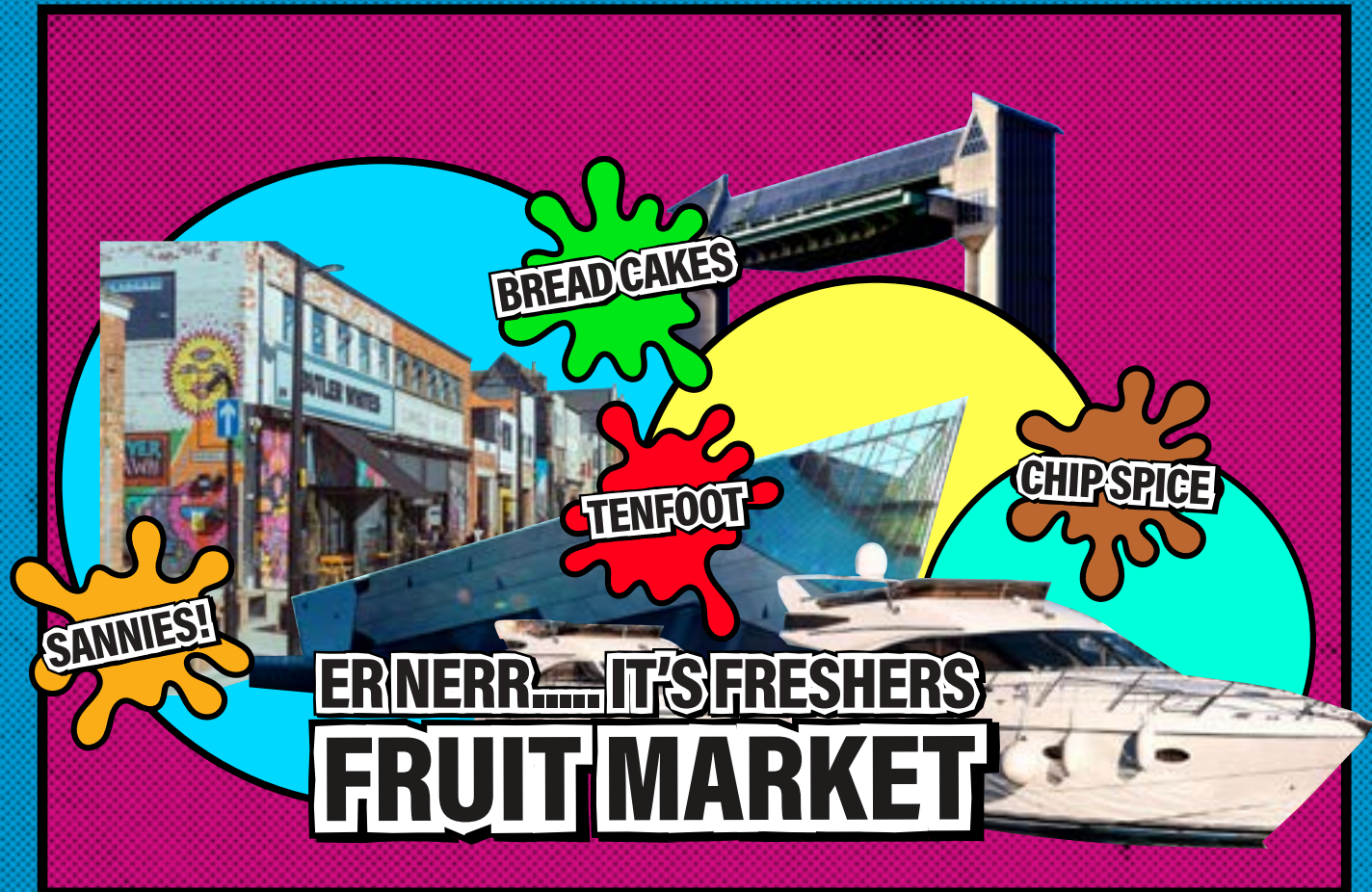




Hull Marina and Humber Street sit at the heart of Hull's waterside heritage, blending maritime history with modern culture. The Marina, opened in 1983, was created from the former Humber and Railway Docks, which once bustled with trading vessels and cargo central to the city's prosperity. As traditional dock work declined in the 20th century, the site was transformed into a leisure marina, attracting yachts and pleasure craft while preserving a link to Hull's seafaring past.

Humber Street was once the centre of Hull's fruit trade, with warehouses stacked high with imported produce. Its cobbled street and brick warehouses remain a striking reminder of Hull's industrial past. By the late 20th century, the area had fallen quiet, but regeneration projects brought it back to life.

Today, Humber Street is home to independent shops, bars, galleries, and the celebrated Humber Street Sesh music festival, making it a vibrant and exciting cultural quarter.



1. Fruit Market & Humberst

Hull's Fruit Market was once the bustling hub of the city's wholesale fruit and vegetable trade, with warehouses stacked high with imported produce.

Among its quirky history is Dead Bod, a bird mural which greeted sailors returning to port. The mural can now be found in Humber Street Gallery's Café.

Humber Street is one of Hull's liveliest spots for students. It's packed with bars, cafes, restaurants, and independent shops, and is perfect for nights out, weekend brunches, gifts and live music.

Street art and live events make it a social and creative hotspot in the heart of the city.

2. The Deep

Dive into The Deep, Hull's award-winning aquarium. Experience awe-inspiring marine life up close, including sawfish, turtles, penguins and much more!

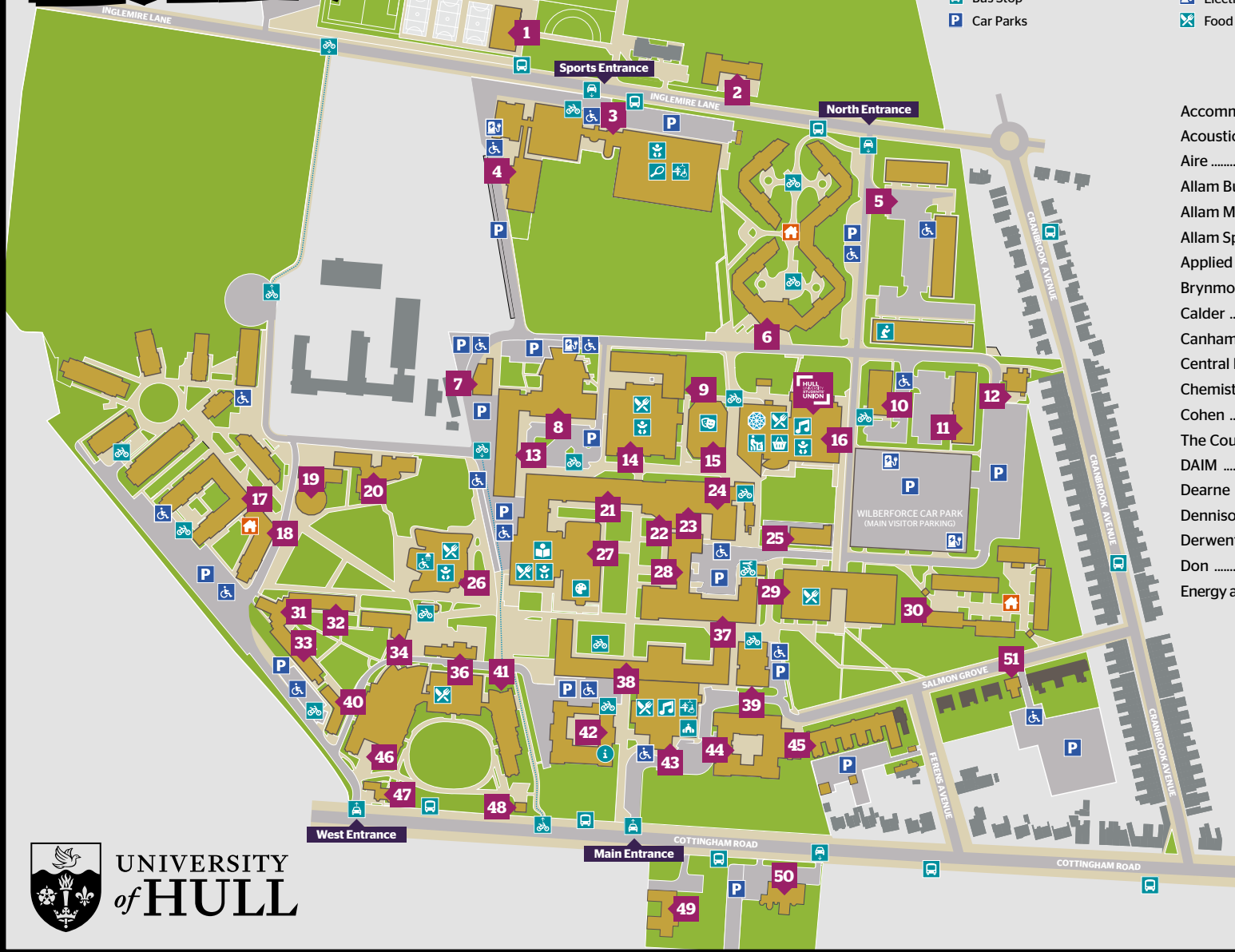


Student Central

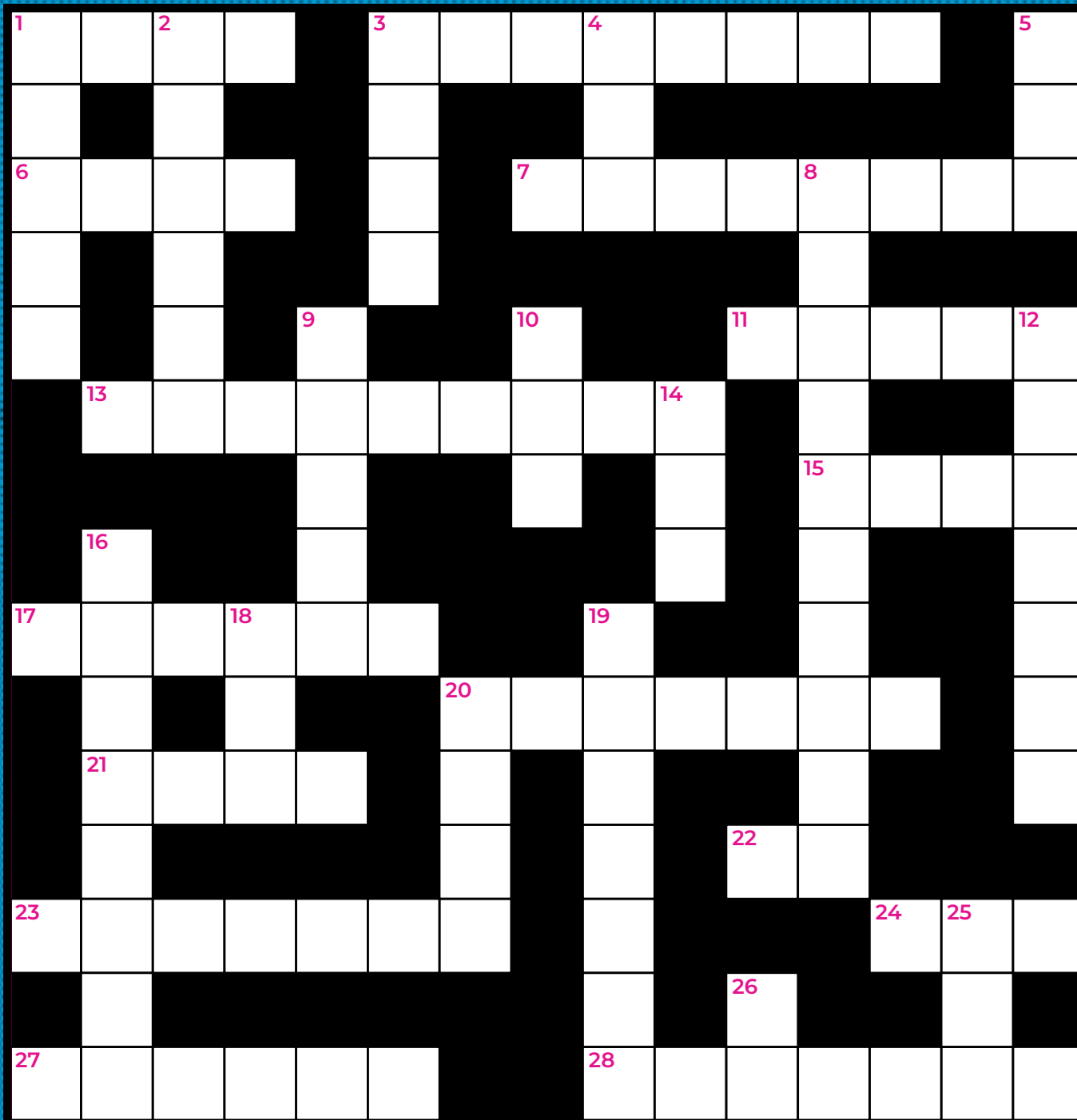

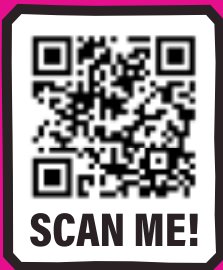

GLOSSARY OF TERMS:

Baine/Bain – A young child. Both spellings are commonly used in Hull.

Breadcake – Our word for a bread roll or bread bun.

Chowd – When your mum tells you off in Hull, you may say you're being "chowd at".

Croggy – A ride on someone else's bike, usually with you sitting on the handlebars, crossbar, or the back wheel pegs while your mate pedals. If someone says "giza croggy!", they're requesting a lift.

Giza – Give me or let me have.

Larking – Playing. "Larking out" is the same as "playing out".

Mafting – Really hot. Boiling. Sweltering. If you're mafting, you're uncomfortably warm.

Mam – The local word for mum.

Mardy – Moody, sulky, or grumpy.

Nerr – No.

Nithered – Freezing. Really cold.

Owt – Anything. "Owt good on telly?"

Pattie – A deep-fried mash potato cake, usually seasoned with sage, dipped in batter, and fried until golden. You'll only find these in Hull and East Yorkshire. Order one with a breadcake, you won't be disappointed!

Reyt – Really, very, fine or okay. "That's reyt good" "it'll be reyt".

Skeg – Look at or have a glance. If someone says "giza skeg", they're asking to have a look.

Snicket – A narrow alleyway or cut through.

Tenfoot – Hull slang for a passageway behind houses, named after its typical width.

Twagging – Skipping school or playing truant.

'Ull – Hull in the Hull accent, of course!

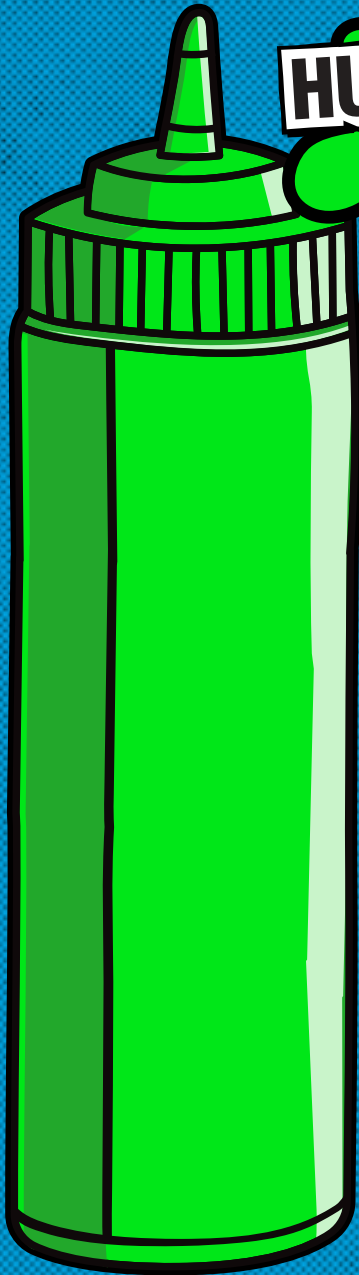

What is a Bid?

A Business Improvement District (BID) is a defined geographical area. There are currently 320 BIDS in the UK. HullBID covers the nucleus of the city centre and represents over 780 businesses, spread across 1,174 commercial properties.

Our BID members are diverse and include those from the private, public and voluntary sectors.

BIDs are generally not-for-profit; they do not replace or subsidise existing public bodies and services, but enhance them. Baseline service level agreements are set and a BID provides specific improvements over and above these services.

Since HullBID was established in 2006, it has worked to a business agenda and delivered significant improvements, particularly in terms of safety and cleanliness. HullBID has also organised and promoted events and activities to attract more people into the city centre and generate more trade.

We exist to help businesses in the city to sustainably grow and progress. We organise our activity around four strategic aims, representing the important role we play in the development, regeneration and prosperity of Hull city centre.
