

LEAD KENT: VICE-PRESIDENT WELFARE AND COMMUNITY

The Vice-President (Welfare and Community) is Kent Union's lead officer for campaigning to defend the rights of and improve the wellbeing of students. The Full-time Officers the 16,000 students at the University. The successful candidate will be expected to represent all students in line with the 2010 equality act and should be an effective voice for any student issues they might be facing. This role is the union's lead on wellbeing, liberation, housing and local community based projects. The officer will also be responsible for Kent Union's work on the environment and sustainability. The Vice-President (Welfare and Community) is a member of the Board of Trustees of Kent Union.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- To promote, extend and defend the rights of all students at the University of Kent.
- To act as a voice of students to Kent Union, the University and external organisations.
- To represent students on all welfare matters.
- To ensure that the officer team is working well together and that the work the team produces is to a high standard and meets students' needs.
- To work with local government councils and other relevant external organisations for the benefit of students at the University of Kent in the local community.
- To be the lead for student housing matters and support the Nightline service.
- To lead on liberation, wellbeing and EDI related work, including Kent Union's EDI Strategy.
- To be the lead on environmental and sustainability work.
- To run campaigns on welfare and community issues and to assist in campaigns that other officers may be running.
- To work with Liberation networks to benefit the lives of students at the University.

- Meet with the Representation & Democracy team to agree plans to improve student wellbeing and representation of Liberation groups.
- Working on the student priorities voted on, decided by the students you represent.
- Alongside other Officers, meet with University leaders to discuss issues affecting students.
- Meet with stakeholders to lobby for improvements for students by making more opportunities.
- Work closely with the Chief Executive to oversee EDI strategic planning.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES AS A TRUSTEE

As a Full-time Officer you will also be a Trustee; Trustees deliver the responsibilities detailed in the Terms of Reference of the Board of Trustees.

- Ensure that Kent Union acts in accordance with its charitable objects, constitution and other guiding documents and, in particular, remains true to its Vision and Values.
- Help Kent Union achieve its objectives and improve the lives of its members.
- Ensure that Kent Union complies with all relevant legislation and regulations, including relevant charity acts and education acts.
- Ensure that Kent Union does not undertake activities that put its financial stability, members or reputation at undue risk.
- Work with other trustees, staff and volunteers in a constructive manner and for the greater good of Kent Union.
- Participate fully in Board meetings and join one of the Board's Committees.
- Use their personal skills and experience to ensure Kent Union is well run and efficient.
- Seek external professional advice where there may be material risk to Kent Union or where the Trustees may be in breach of their duties, or at any other appropriate moment.
- Add value to the Board and Kent Union through generating ideas, challenging the status quo, broadening thinking and supporting and promoting innovation and creativity.
- Ensure decisions of the Board and its Committees take account of the needs and views of Kent Union's members.
- Ensure Kent Union considers the needs and views of all student groups, for example postgraduate, international and part-time students.
- Ensure effective communication between Kent Union and its members.
