Reps worked with the VP: Education & Advocacy to reschedule the resit exam timetable by the academic board, allowing thousands of international students to apply for the Post Study Work visa.

Successfully advocated for new buses to replace the old Brookes buses.

Addressed communication issues between students and dissertation supervisors, resulting in improved supervisor support.

Addressed Turnitin comparison ratings and inconsistencies in student support communications, enhancing a sense of support and employability through increased career talks.

Policy changes

- University to appoint an additional Student Money Adviser following SU feedback on financial literacy issues during Access and Participation Plan (APP) consultations.
- Financial literacy program launched to help students manage living costs, initiated from Students' Union feedback.
- University's APP policy now includes students under 25 without living parents.
- Influenced the University's upcoming Attendance and Engagement Policy to include employability relevance and clear Fitness to Study triggers.
- Shaping the Sexual Consent Education Strategy by defining staff training for managing disclosures and ensuring inclusion of key stakeholders.
- Substance misuse policy revised to prioritise educational support over punitive measures, while maintaining consequences for behavioural misconduct under influence.





The Biological Society have become affiliated with the prestigious Institute of Biomedical Science (IBMS).




Oxford Brookes Musical Theatre Society had a hugely successful performance of *Spring Awakening*.

Paramedic Society ran a Post Mortem Live event where members got to take part in an immersive event to experience an autopsy to receive a 4-hour CPD certificate.


